Report on the Use of the Promotion of Reading Grant
2019-20 School Year

Part 1: Evaluation of the Effectiveness

1. Evaluation of the objective:

The objective of “Strengthening the reading skills and motivation of students through reading schemes, learning and teaching activities and providing resources for students to facilitate reading to learn and enhance reading across the curriculum” is partially achieved due to the extended period of class suspension.

Most activities planned for the second term were postponed or cancelled and purchase of reading materials has also been reduced. Both printed and online reading resources were provided for students and were well received. Most activities in the first term were carried out successfully and the general atmosphere of reading across the curriculum has been formed.

2. Evaluation of strategies:

Strategies including “subject-based reading resources provided for students to strengthen reading to learn and reading across the curriculum” and “reading schemes and activities to be provided for students” were effective to help strengthening the reading skills and motivation of students.

Students have participated actively in the reading activities and competitions organised on campus and online and performed well in joint-school and inter-school activities. During the extended period of class suspension, teachers concerned have uploaded e-reading materials and related links to facilitate online reading and continued to carry out reading programmes and activities.
