
Introduction to KaiTak@KowloonCity Study Centre

Salute to Kai Tak Airport



History of Landmarks in the Kowloon City **District**

Together, these sites illustrate the diverse narratives that shape Hong Kong's identity and its historical journey.



Historical Footprints



Today, several viewpoints in Kowloon City reflect the history of the area. Designated spots in Kowloon Walled City Park and around the MTR stations of Sung Wong Toi and Kai Tak are marked on the exhibition boards. Visitors can enhance their understanding of these heritage spots through mixed reality experiences using provided devices.



History of Kowloon City



As you enter the corridor, you will encounter a timeline exhibiting the cityscape and topography of Kowloon City, illustrating its history from the mid-1800s to the mid-1900s.

San Po Kong in the early days

San Po Kong in the early 1970s was a burgeoning area that emerged following the reconstruction of Kai Tak Airport, a process that began after the Japanese occupation in the 1950s. In 1970, Cognitio College (Kowloon) established its San Po Kong campus, contributing to the area's educational growth and community development.
